

Living at Home Waiver Program

Providing community services and supports to enable people with physical disabilities to live in their own home.

What is Family Training Services?

Family Training Services – Instruction about treatment regimens and the use of equipment specified in the plan of service for one or more family members at the same time in the participant’s home or the provider’s office.

Types of Family Training Service Providers

There are two types of Family Training Service Providers: Consumer – Employed Model and Agency – Employed Model.

Consumer – Employed Model – a self-employed, Medicaid provider, licensed as a registered nurse, nurse practitioner, occupational therapist, speech pathologist or physical therapist.

Agency – Employed Model – an agency that is a Medicaid provider which employs a licensed registered nurse, nurse practitioner, occupational therapist, speech pathologist or physical therapist.

Credentials for Consumer Employed Family Training Service Providers

1. Consumer Employed Model – copy of current license as a:
 - A. Registered Nurse, or
 - B. Nurse Practitioner, or
 - C. Occupational Therapist, or
 - D. Physical Therapist, or
 - E. Speech Pathologist
2. Copy of current resume demonstrating experience in the skill being taught, training of personal care aides or attendants, and attendant care needs of adults with disabilities

Credentials for Agency Employed Family Training Service Providers

1. Agency - Employed Model – copy of current license for each individual that will perform service for the waiver:
 - A. Registered Nurse, or
 - B. Nurse Practitioner, or
 - C. Occupational Therapist, or
 - D. Physical Therapist, or
 - E. Speech Pathologist

2.
 - A. List of all family trainers with name and social security numbers
 - B. Copy of current resume demonstrating experience in the skill being taught, training of personal care aides or attendants, and attendant care needs of adults with disabilities
